
experiments using liquid Nitrogen. Cryogenics is the science of how you make things really cold and what happens when you do that!!


Come out to see Jerry break his hand and eat "cyromallows" dipped in liquid Nitrogen. Watch him perform

Health Topic: Diabetes and Gum Disease

According to the American Diabetes Association, there are more than 20 million Americans with diabetes. As this number continues to increase, the short and long-term effects of diabetes on the body are becoming apparent such as heart attack, stroke, blindness and oral health disease.

Studies have shown that subjects with uncontrolled diabetes (prolonged blood sugar of over 120 mg/dL) are 3x more likely to have periodontal disease, or gum disease, than those with well-controlled diabetes. The reasons behind this

have to do with the inflammatory response of the body. The cells which successfully fight against an infection are altered in people with diabetes. As these cells, called neutrophils, monocytes, and macrophages, are impaired; the body's first line of defense is in jeopardy. The bacteria then are able to survive within the pockets between the gums and teeth, causing destruction.

Despite all this information, having diabetes does not automatically mean you will have gum disease. There are many ways of preventing

gum disease. If a person's diabetes is well-managed by diet, exercise, and medication, they are less likely to see some of these harmful effects. Maintaining good oral hygiene by brushing and flossing twice a day can significantly reduce the amount of bacteria that has been shown to cause gum disease. It is also important to visit a dentist 2-3 times a year for an examination of the gums and professional cleaning. Keeping all of this in mind, anyone with diabetes can keep their healthy smile for their entire lives.

Why do we ring a Bell in Temples?

Before you enter a temple – to awake and prepare you for the taste of awareness is the real reason behind the temple bell. In other words, "it helps to ring in order to wake yourself up!" To an extent fragrant generators, low light lamps all form ecosystem to help create awareness.

The Bell is an indispensable part in most Hindu pujas. Bell is sounded before the actual puja and worship begins. A well-designed bell produce long strains of the sound 'OM.' A bell is rung in a Hindu temple, during the

waving of light in front of the deity, while bathing the deity and while offering food. Hindu devotees upon entering the temple also hit the bell hung in front of the sanctum sanctorum.

A Temple bell is another scientific phenomena; it is not just your ordinary metal. It is made of various metals including Cadmium, Lead, Copper, Zinc, Nickel, Chromium and Manganese. The proportion at which each one of them mixed is real science behind a bell. Each of these bells is made

to produce such a distinct sound that it can create unity of your left and right brain. The moment you ring that bell, it produces sharp, but lasting sound which lasts for a minimum of seven seconds in echo mode good enough to touch your seven healing centers or chakras in your body.

Festivals - Ganesh Chaturthi

Thursday, 17-September

Ganesh Chaturthi or
"Vinayak Chaturthi" is one
of the major traditional
festivals celebrated by the
Hindu community. It is
observed in the Hindu
calendar month of
Bhadrapada, starting on the
shukla chaturthi (fourth day
of the waxing moon
period). Typically the day
falls sometime between

August 20 and September 15. The festival lasts for 10 days, ending on Ananta Chaturdashi, and is traditionally celebrated as the birthday of Lord Ganesha.

It is believed that Lord Ganesh was born on a fourth day (chaturthi) of the bright fortnight of the Hindu lunar month of Magh. Since then, an association between Ganesh and chaturthi has been established. Thus the festival dedicated to the worship of Lord Ganesha on this chaturthi day is named as Ganesh Chaturthi.

Many people bring Ganesh murti to their home for 1 to 10 days where they worship the Lord Ganesha. The Ganesh Chaturthi 'Visarjan' ceremony is marked with great pomp and vivacity with distinct music, dance and drum-beat element.


